

- \$1,866,136 spent on library materials in FY15

- 1,157 print and online records for State of Colorado documents were cataloged and added to our collection
- 5,501 federal documents were cataloged and added to our collection

- 78,911 streaming audio files are now accessible through the Library's catalog







Access Services

In addition to checking out, checking back in, and shelving close to 100,000 physical items any given year, our Access Services (circulation) department was very busy with several behind the scenes projects. A few follow:

- Extended building hours during pre-finals and finals week
- Set up 2 charging stations for phones, tablets, and laptops
- Removed the security gate arms to make it easier for our disabled users to enter and exit the Library
- Created the Senior Circulation Student Assistant position to allow us to better serve our clientele and to give 2 student employees experience in a management position
- Worked with Web Services and Emerging Technologies to implement an automated patron registration program no longer will our new users have to complete a registration card!
- Completed the move of our dvds out from behind the circulation area to the public shelving area by the reference desk
- Tagged and removed thousands of old serials so we could build the collaborative learning center







Interlibrary Loan

Interlibrary Loan offers access to materials UCCS patrons are unable to obtain through the Kraemer Family Library (KFL) or the Prospector catalog. In addition, document delivery is provided for articles available in the KFL print and electronic collections.

Library patrons use ILLiad software to place and manage ILL requests.

A few highlights from the past year:

- Electronic delivery of article requests available through the Kraemer Family Library are delivered the same business day
- Electronic delivery of article requests not available at KFL are delivered, on average, within 3 business days
- Loan requests for materials not available at KFL such as books, microfilm, and DVDs, are delivered, on average, within 10 business days
- 745 individuals registered for ILLiad accounts an increase of 105 from the previous year
- The Interlibrary Loan department received the highest number of ILL requests, 805, from individuals affiliated with the College of Beth-El Nursing
- ILL instituted the use of USPS tracking labels as a cost saving measure and ability to verify delivery of physical materials
- Physical materials were borrowed from and loaned to locations in Australia, Canada, Germany, Great Britain, and Puerto Rico

UCCS University Archives

The UCCS University Archives was renovated during the summer of 2014 thanks to a generous donation received from long-time benefactor and supporter, Mrs. Dona Hildebrand. The construction of the wall shown in the photograph has created secure storage for the collections, a separate research area, and the Hildebrand Display Area within the University Archives.



In the months leading up to and during the UCCS 50th Anniversary year celebration, the University Archives has worked with every College and the Graduate School to document the history of the campus. Archival materials appear in interactive timelines and maps, displays and exhibits, and publications. The campus oral history has been revived and will continue after the anniversary year. Three graduate students in the History Department have completed internships within the University Archives.



IDIGITAL COLLECTIONS OF COLORADO

UCCS continues to participate in the Digital Collections of Colorado, a collaborative digital repository with CSU, School of Mines, and the Anshultz Medical Campus. In the last year, the repository has moved to an open source DSpace platform which will give us more flexibility while still allowing us to digitally shared campus research with the world.

Collections include dissertations, historical student newspapers, and faculty and student research.





Web Services and Emerging Technologies Projects

The Library's newest department, Web Services and Emerging Technologies, headed by Associate Professor Tabatha Farney, and staffed with Assistant Professor Joel Tonyan and IT Professional Shad Harder, has been very busy this past year planning, implementing, and fine tuning a number of projects that are keeping the Kraemer Family Library in line with technology expectations for academic libraries. Good bye Old Dusty Serials Hello Collaborative Learning Area!


